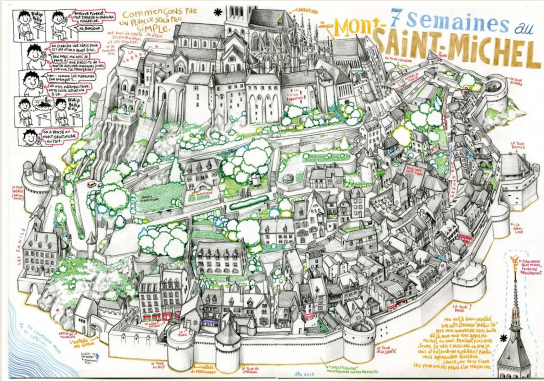


# MAP

# Our Cathedral



The most beautiful building in town is of course La Merveille, our very own church and monastery. This magnificent building rests 900 meters in circumference and 78 meters tall. For this great pleasure we give credit, where it is due, to King Philip II of France (learn mor on next page).

This wonder is split into two sections. The first being the common area for worship, this is where the public may worship. The other section being the cells of the monks where they may personally study in His word.

# History



Our great city was once named Mont-Tombe. Mont Saint Michel was given after the great bishop of Avranches, Saint Albert, witnessed the arc angel Micheal on our very soil and quickly built a small but beautiful oratory on our grounds. This became a small but popular sight until the year 966. In 966, a Benedictine Abby was created out of the oratory. From this the black monks had it all. Of course until 1203.

In that year King Philip II of France tried to take out lovely city by force. He succeeded and was generous enough to donate money to any damage done to the Abby. It was set ablaze for some time. With reconstruction the people of Mont Saint Michel were granted the beautiful monastery. It was named La Merveille, translating to The Wonder.
